Standardized Tests

- ACT: LATE registration by May 18 for the test on June 9
- **SAT**: LATE registration by **May 23** for the test on June 2

Late Registration costs extra money! Extra \$29 for SAT, extra \$29.50 for ACT

• These fees are NOT covered by a fee waiver.





Concordia University (Austin, Texas)

Concordia University partnering with ACC

<u>Concordia Connect 3 + 1</u> (an affordable Bachelor's degree)

- Year 1 and 2: Complete AAS degree at ACC (60 credits)
- Year 3: Become a Concordia student and complete general education courses at ACC to fill the Texas Core Curriculum (27 credits)
- Year 4: Finish final year at an ACC campus, but with Concordia instructors and courses (37 credits)

Students pay ACC tuition for the first three years of the program and pay Concordia's tuition the final year. Financial aid and payment plans are offered all four years of the program.

Similar program with Texas A&M Engineering

Texas A&M-Chevron Engineering Academy at Austin Community College

- Admission to the College of Engineering at Texas A&M University-College Station from day one.
- An opportunity to take Texas A&M engineering courses from Texas A&M faculty on the ACC Highland Campus (HLC)
- An opportunity to join a community of Engineering Academy peers by taking math, science and engineering courses with other Engineering Academy students.
- An opportunity to participate in student activities and organizations at both institutions to the extent possible.
- An affordable pathway to earning a Texas A&M Engineering degree.







Graphic Design as a major

- Graphic design majors learn the design and computer skills necessary to create the look for books, magazines, CD jackets, websites, and more. (<u>Big future</u>)
- Includes instruction in computer-assisted art and design, printmaking, concepts sketching, technical drawing, color theory, imaging, studio technique, still and life modeling, multimedia applications, communication skills and commercial art business operations (<u>src</u>)

 - Put together a portfolio, Exhibit your work
 - Study in a tight-knit community, Work long hours in the studio
